

- \* Learn where to find additional resources on the braided creative nonfiction essay


\* Learn a 5-minute mind-map to discover 2-3 braids for your creative nonfiction

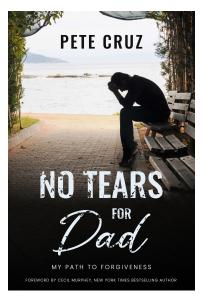

### Sign Up or Come to Listen



Now kicking off our fourth year, the Open Readings event is a platform for sharing portions of our work from all genres, including poetry, and receiving immediate feedback.

As April is National Poetry Month, this Open Reading will feature poetry from our members. Other forms are welcome to fill out our remaining time slots. Come and listen to what our members have written. The Zoom link for the next Open Reading will be published in the March and April Newsletters and posted on our CWC-Sac website.

If you wish to read your material, contact <u>2johnpatterson@gmail.com</u> to sign up for the Open Readings.

Typically, with time for about six writers, the one and half to two-hour event has provided not only casual writer-to-writer interaction, but insight and entertainment for all participants. Members gain insight about the work of other members, as well as their writing inspirations and goals.

The pieces read are expected to be self-contained, such as a chapter or a little story. However, those are not limitations. A vivid description of a character, event, scene, or essay is also welcome. We have not yet had a screenplay piece. The Moderator, John Patterson, requests each author submit a brief introduction of the author and/or the piece to be read. The reading time limitation is eight (8) minutes. All readers are encouraged to practice reading their piece out loud (which is slower-takes more timethan reading to yourself).

Writers who've signed up will receive additional information from John about two weeks prior to the event. Those who come to listen are reminded to consider the reader's needs: thus, no use of chats; big physical movements; eating; talking; etc. during the actual readings. John will open the event at 6:40 pm for visiting. Please plan to arrive before 7:00 pm. If you link in during a reading, the moderator may wait until the end of the reading to admit you.

**Lally Pia** was one of two winners of the 2022 STEP contest (**S**he Writes Press and SparkPress **T**oward **E**quality in **P**ublishing). The purpose of this contest is to support inclusivity across publishing lists, and to give voice to women writers. The prize is the full services of either the She Writes Press or the SparkPress Publishing Package (each valued at \$8500). Lally's memoir *Doctor of Doctors* has a publication date of April 30, 2024 with She Writes Press.

Long-time member **Elva Anson** passed away in December. She was the author of six books, three of which sold close to 20,000 copies. Elva was inspired by her friend, Kiyo Sato, to write her memoir, *Wondering Around God*. Here is how one reviewer, Elisabeth Kersten, retired Director of Calif. Senate Office of Research, describes it. "Elva Anson is a first-rate storyteller. She knows just how much detail to give the reader to get you engaged. She packs in stories from every phase of her life. She really captures life in the Central Valley. This is the story of an amazing woman who found love, a teaching career, a counseling profession, as well as unshakable faith and inner peace-in spite of living during the tumultuous times of World War II and the Korean War. Her humility, humor and resilience are truly remarkable and life affirming. She ends with practical aphorisms but her narrative is not pedantic, just real and honest."

**Jim Guigli** has published another Flash Fiction crime story, "<u>Ben Hurt</u>," which you can read online. He has also recently published "Not Funny" (where a standup comedian borrows trouble) in *Guilty Crime Story Magazine, Issue Seven.* And finally, his story "Blood on the Stairs," another Bart Lasiter tale, appears in the new anthology by Murderous Ink Press, *CRIMEUCOPIA We'll Be Right Back -- After This!*

### THE LAST "OPEN READING" TRANSPORTED LISTENERS

Seven writers from our branch shared their word craft at the last Open Reading on Dec. 1. The evening Zoom event permitted the writers' authentic voices to create virtual experiences.

Writers read self-contained pierces in short reads. Many have won awards and all shared insights from profound experiences. We heard the mind voyages as listeners were taken back in time and around the world.

Judy Presnall, who has written thirty books and won third place in children's non-fiction at a CWC Asilomar Conference, read a piece being developed for young people about Rachel Carson, widely considered to be the heroic force behind the modern environmental movement.

Chris Hennessey, a Board member and winner of numerous awards for writing, directing, and producing films, read "This is What I Just Went Through." This multi-year recounting takes us quickly through a battle with cancer, radiation treatments, follow up treatments, and medical issues. His recounting takes us to the next life step where his very premature daughter is also fighting to survive. She is now thriving, and Chris' current activities indicate he is thriving as well.

Bonnie Blue recently finished her memoir and had a tale about her family raccoon published in our CWC-Sac Anthology. Bonnie read a piece with observations about birds and gardening from her spiritual journey in the Findhorn, Scotland community.


Dr. Lally Pia, a child psychiatrist who has two chapters of her memoir published, one in our Anthology and another in the CWC Literary Review, read about her youth in Kumasi, Ghana. Her successful Tamil parents took the family, fleeing Sri Lanka to Ghana on haunting bus rides to escape the pogroms against the Tamils.

Marcia Ehinger, a retired physician and professional medical writer, a winner of this Branch's Jack London Award, and with publications in <u>California Update</u> and <u>Visions</u>, read poems centering on historic Portuguese women.

Larry Mandelberg, a columnist and author of *Businesses Don't Fail, They Commit Suicide,* read some history of his family's multi-generational businesses, continually re-inventing themselves as they moved through much of North America.

Tim Schooley, a retired attorney and law school professor who won the 2022 U.O.P. Creative Writing Conference's Jameson Award, for *The Wool Translator*, read from a current work in progress, *Bread and Circus*. This journey, after he graduated from Clown College, took us to circus trains and tents with great looksees behind the curtains.

Some members came only to listen to members' work while hearing more about the world. You should consider our next event, April 13.



Lisel Mueller was born in Hamburg, Germany, in 1924. Her books of poetry include *Alive Together: New & Selected Poems* (Louisiana State University Press, 1996), which won the Pulitzer Prize. Her other honors include the Carl Sandburg Award and a National Endowment for the Arts fellowship. She lived in Lake Forest, Illinois and died on February 21, 2020.
