National Poetry Month Featuring Davis Poet Andy Jones

On behalf of National Poetry Month, April's luncheon speaker will be Dr. Andy Jones, UC Davis writing

professor, poet, radio talk show host and public speaker.

He has taught for the English Department and the University Writing Program at the University of California, Davis, since 1990. Originally trained as a poet and interpreter of poetry, Andy taught classes on TS Eliot, the Poetry of the Beat Generation, and Close Reading of Poetry, as well as the Advanced Poetry Writing Workshop. As a lecturer in the University Writing Program, Andy enjoys teaching pre-professional writing classes, and counts among his favorites "Writing in the Professions: Journalism," "Style and the Essay," and "Writing in Education: Advanced Writing for Future Teachers" which he has taught since 1996.

Since 2000, he has hosted "Dr. Andy's Poetry and Technology Hour" on Davis radio station KDVS, Wednesdays at 5 p.m. He also coordinates and hosts Poetry Night Reading Series on the first and third Thursdays at the John Natsoulas Gallery in Davis.

His recent publications include an essay on Beat Art and Poetry in *Lifescapes Magazine*, a book chapter on teaching writing and literature with Twitter, and a book of poetry, *Split Stock*, that he co-authored. His poems have appeared in many small journals and newspapers, including *Poetry Digest*, *Epicenter*, *A Light Left On*, *The Homestead Review*, *Snakeskin*, *The Blue Moon Literary and Art Review*, and *The Sacramento News and Review*.

The title of Andy's presentation will be "Obligations and the Poet: An Update and An Argument."

A retired police officer, one-time technical writer and worn out college professor, Shawn began designing websites 14 years ago. Shawn specializes in simplifying complex tasks, so those who consider themselves technophobes need not live in fear. To this end, she leads a variety of marketing, Social Media, and website design seminars.

A professional writer since 2006, Shawn has sold over 100 stories. Most recently, her work was featured in the Upper Rubber Boot Books anthology *140 and Counting*.

Turning her attention back to her nonfiction roots, Shawn has self-published the first book in her Made Simple Series, *Search Engine Optimization Made Simple*.

At the Writers Network Meeting, Shawn will share several easy-to-implement SEO, social media marketing and time management tips, answer your questions, and leave you inspired to improve and grow your author platform and online presence.

The CWC Writers Network meets the first Friday of every month, 9 a.m., at International House of Pancakes (IHOP), 2216 Sunrise Blvd., Rancho Cordova (north of Highway 50). Participants include book, newspaper, magazine, and trade journal writers. Order and pay for your own breakfast.

I attended the January Central Board meeting. The Central Board is the parent organization of the California Writers Club. Each of the eighteen branches sent a delegate, many of them the branch president, to represent their members. The atmosphere was electric. Ideas were shared, encouragement and support offered. As introductions began around the table, I scribbled madly, wishing I'd brought a tape recorder instead of a notebook.

CWC High Desert reported great success with critique groups, including one from their outreach program at the federal penitentiary. CWC Fremont is actively establishing their Publishing Pathways program to help writers navigate the journey of publication. CWC Mt. Diablo is active within the public library system. They visit local libraries and present regular informal seminars, such as one titled, "So You Want to Write a Book." CWC Inland Empire's president spoke enthusiastically about the one-hour writing exercise that is part of their monthly meeting.

These were just a few of the ideas I thought offered enrichment. Mentoring and critique groups, active within many branches, inspire me to seek volunteers to help establish these programs within our branch.

The Central Board recently completed and published *Lit Review*, a collection of writings selected from members' submissions. It will be mailed to all members, a benefit of club membership. I'm anxious to receive my copy, because I know it will inspire me to support an anthology in our branch.

All these marvelous ideas need energetic and dedicated volunteers to make them a reality. Are you one of them? Liz Allenby is. She is the new Contest Chair and board of director member. Follow her lead and get involved. You will be glad you did.

Her many articles include *A Road Map of the New Spirituality, Cat Rescues Woman in Distress, Lava Beds National Monument and Southern Oregon* and *The Subconscious Mind*.

CWC Sacramento Branch 2012-2013 Election

Heed the call for action! Support your Sacramento Branch of the California Writers Club by volunteering to serve as an officer for a one-year term July 2012 to June 2013. You will have time to work as an apprentice with the officer who currently holds the position and you will ALWAYS have the support of past officers. The time commitment is approximately 6-8 hours per month including the monthly luncheon meeting, for nine months (no membership luncheon meetings in July, August, and December). Our group is growing and it is your turn to help. No one is too young, too old, too new, or too inexperienced. The current officers will train you, and it is not difficult.

Officers are responsible for setting a tone of engagement and for encouraging a harmonius and collaborative operation, both in meetings and in associated communication.

President

In addition to other duties described in the Sacramento Board's Policies and Procedures and Bylaws, the President shall: Preside over the Sacramento Branch general and board meetings and determine the time and place for special board meetings; create and distribute meeting agendas, select three (3) to seven (7) members to serve on the Board of Directors, with approval of the Executive Board; and appoint committee chairs for on-going functions, special events, and other club-related business such as, but not limited to an Anthology Committee Chair, annual Genre Meeting Chair, Seminar Committee Chair, and Outreach Committee Chair. Committee chairs so appointed will have the responsibility to create, subject to the President's approval, specific rules and/or guidelines for their activities.

First Vice President/Programs

In addition to other duties described in the Sacramento Board's Policies and Procedures and Bylaws, the First Vice President/Program shall:

Assume the President's duties when the President is unable to act; be responsible for arranging guest speakers, providing the speaker's contact information, topic, and other information to the Public Relations Chair, Newsletter Editor and Web Coordinator; maintain contact with scheduled speakers to ensure they know the date, time, and location of the applicable meeting; and act as the speaker's host and introduce the speaker at the general meeting.

Second Vice President/Membership

In addition to other duties described in the Sacramento Board's Policies and Procedures and Bylaws, the Second Vice President/Membership shall:

Create subcommittees to deal with the administration of membership matters with approval of the Board; collect membership dues and renewals, new member applications and provide addresses for newsletter mailings and the branch roster; assist in maintaining the official roster and provide quarterly membership updates to the Central Board maintaining appropriate files for the review of the Sacramento Branch President and Executive Board; and forward appropriate forms and money to the Central Board.

Secretary

In addition to other dutes described in the Central Board's Policies and Procedures and Bylaws, the Secretary shall: Take minutes of all duly called branch board meetings and distribute them afterward and handle official correspondence as requested by the President.

Treasurer

In addition to other duties described in the Sacramento Board's Policies and Procedures and Bylaws, the Treasurer shall: Keep all accounts in good order and prepare the Board's mandated quarterly balance sheet, income statement, expense statement and monthly reconciliation reports and deliver each to the Central Board quarterly and annually; report the branch's financial condition at monthly board meetings; prepare an annual budget with the advice of the President and/or other branch board members; and be an authorized signer for all checks issued to vendors.

You may volunteer to serve, or nominate someone else. If you nominate someone else, make sure he/she accepts the nomination first. Voting ballots will be included in the May newsletter.
