Presentation is Everything or What Makes a Great Book Cover by Karen A. Phillips, *Review by Mari-Lynne Infantino*.

CWC Sacramento's First Friday presentation on November 3 was everything I hoped it would be. Starting with the title of her presentation, I was keen to hear the information our presenter had to share. Karen Phillips is a professional graphic designer with a degree in Applied Art and Design, who, as her website informs us, has a passion for book cover design. As an author herself, she prefers to work with authors who self-publish. Karen packed her presentation with important information that many of us are not always aware of.

Almost immediately she grabbed our attention with the following statement. According to the Wall Street Journal, a book is judged by its cover within four seconds. In that amount of time, we need to grab our reader's attention with a cover that includes a storyline teaser, a brief author bio, and a book review or quote about the book if possible.

Karen provided a number of colorful book cover slides, each conveying a different feel by genre and its importance to the cover, as well as interior book formatting.

The following is a myriad of tips that Karen shared on why it is important to consider hiring a cover artist.


- Book covers need to show a clear genre, its color eye-catching with the mood and tone of the story conveyed. The font should be easy to read at a thumbnail size.
- Some of the key elements to formatting the interior of a book are that it be professional, easy to read, good leading, margins, limited widows and orphans, and justified setting.
- Printed books should be in 12 pt. font, 10 pt. is too small and cramped for easy reading.
- AI is becoming more usable in not only text but also in the art used for your cover. Discuss with your illustrator if you approve of the use of AI.

Your designer needs to understand what you want. Provide a synopsis of your book or, if time permits, a copy of the manuscript itself. Karen provides up to three concepts for the cover. Be sure to discuss with your book cover designer the cost of cover and inside formatting as well as the cost of revisions for both print and e-book design.

<u>Karen A. Phillips</u> is the self-published author of <u>A Deadly Combo</u>, a cozy mystery, and yes, the book cover was designed and illustrated by her. 
